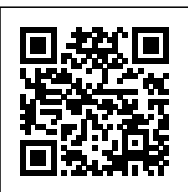


CIVIL DISOBEDIENCE

The 6th Film Projection and Discussion by Nakhijevan Institute of Canada was held in St. Laurent on August 13, 2013 at *Centre Des Loisirs*. The organizers stressed that the aim of the series is to acquaint attendants with historical, political, social and environmental issues which have a bearing on the peoples of the world, including on Armenians in Armenia, as well as in the Diaspora.

On behalf of the organizers, Antranig Bedrossian, MA (international relations, UQAM), explained the three characteristics of civil disobedience: public action; committed group of citizens; and non-violent actions.

In the two cases under discussion, the objective and subjective conditions of each case was identified. In India, the weakening of the British colonial power after WWII, the awakening of the peoples of Asia and their determination to struggle for independence and their rights, and the immense population of India, were all conditions that led to the success of Gandhi's strategy of civil disobedience. In Poland the position of Gorbachev and Soviet non-intervention, the role of the Catholic Church, US-Soviet negotiations, the general tendency in Eastern Europe for change, were all elements contributing to the success of Solidarnosc.

The discussion period continued with special focus on recent civil disobedience actions by young activists in Yerevan against the hike in the price of that city's public transport tickets. The action forced the mayor to suspend the decision. The session stressed the organized, determined and goal-targeted actions of the protesting youth. The activists pointed at the profit-making aims of the partly-privatized system as reason for the city authorities' decision to raise ticket prices. Young activists demanded a well-coordinated transit system for Yerevan under PUBLIC CONTROL, ITS

~~REMOVAL FROM PRIVATE HANDS and the UNIONIZATION of drivers.~~

Future sessions of the film series will include developments in Armenia.
