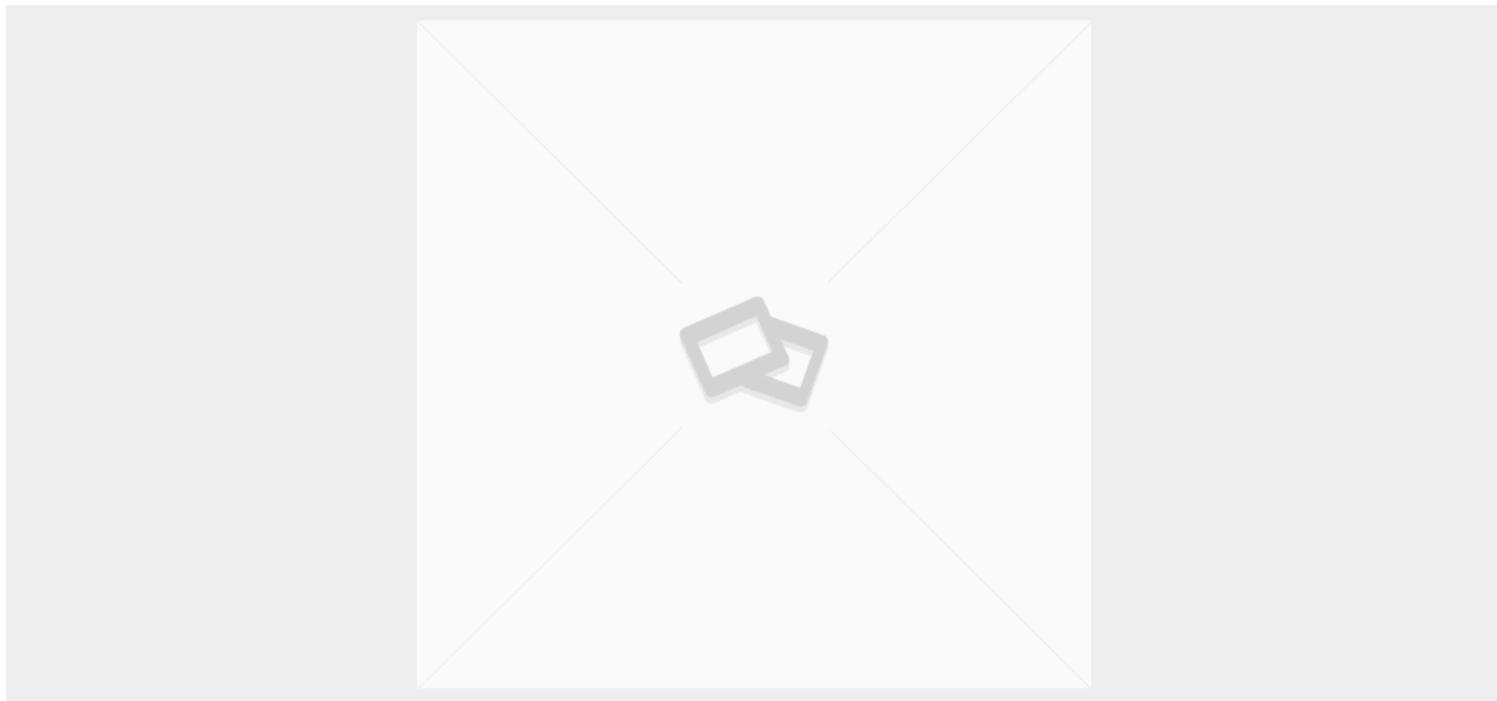


HE WHO DOES NOT WANT TO BE HELPED, CANNOT BE HELPED
