Despite American objections and Israeli warnings, Turkey orchestrated an Iran-Turkey-Brazil deal for enriched uranium to fuel the Nuclear power stations in Iran; Turkish humanitarian aid cargo ships sailed through questionable territorial waters to Palestine creating turmoil in the Islamic world and beyond.

Turkey's stranglehold on petroleum supply through pipelines from its territory to the European continent effectively allowed Turkey to exert control over suppliers of oil from the neighboring Islamic countries, currently from Iran, Iraq, Azerbaijan; also negotiations are on the way with Egypt, and the surplus oil from Sudan and possibly Libya.
